Pre-Requisites

There are no pre-requisites for this course.

Course Requirements

Successful completion of this course requires participants to have the physical ability to respond to an emergency situation and Provide advanced first aid to a casualty. This includes the requirement for all participants to perform at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted CPR on an adult resuscitation manikin placed on the floor.

Foundation skills are the underpinning communication skills required for participation in the workplace, the community and in adult education and training.

Learning – to learn to provide first aid response in remote situations.

Reading – to administer medication to casualty.

Writing – to complete documentation such as reports/risk assessments.

Oral communication – to call the ambulance and provide a handover.

Numeracy – to count the number of compressions and breaths.

All training and assessment materials and equipment will be supplied throughout the course. Students will need to bring a blue or black pen and wear comfortable, casual clothing.

If you are concerned about any of these requirements, please contact your training provider prior to enrolling into the course.

Delivery Modes

- 1. New participants: Online or hard-copy pre-course learning (1-2 hours) plus 1-day classroom training and assessment.
- 2. Renewal training: 1 day classroom training and assessment.

Training and assessment can be adjusted to account for specific workplace requirements and the existing skills and knowledge of the students.
